MORTON CENTER:

- ✓ Morton has received 2 grants to be used in 2016:
 - The Community Foundation has granted \$1585 to be used in the Pottery studio for a new slab roller and table.
 - The Indiana Arts Commission (IAC) provided funds for "Arts in the Parks", Morton will partner with Prophetstown State Park to present a program called "A Day in the Park with Morton". During 1 Saturday in September, Morton instructors will teach several mini workshops that celebrate art and take inspiration from the prairie landscape.

CELERY BOG NATURE AREA/LILLY NATURE CENTER:

- ✓ Shipment of audio boxes received; boxes to be installed along trails & the Celery Bog. Boxes to provide nature interpretation for casual visitor.
- ✓ Tree City USA Report submitted for 25th consecutive year:
 - * 416 new trees have been planted
 - * 118 trees have had to be removed
 - * 1104 trees have been pruned
 - * 25 volunteers contributed 1,036 hours, valued at over \$23,000
