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Work on Salisbury drainage installation progressing

West Lafayette, Ind. - June 15, 2007 - Installation of new sanitary and storm water sewers, which prompted closing of Salisbury Street from State to Columbia and South Street from Salisbury to North Chauncey is progressing well, says Jeromy Grenard, assistant city engineer.

New sanitary and storm sewers are now in place on Salisbury from State to South, and sanitary sewers are in on South. Most of the new sidewalk and drive approaches have also been completed on both sides of Salisbury in that area.

"The underground work is the most critical, because we don't know for sure what we'll find until we get there, and that has gone very well," Grenard says.

The \$560,000 project, which is being constructed by Atlas Excavating, is currently on schedule and expected to be completed by fall.

Maps showing alternate routes are available at Morton Community Center, the West Lafayette Public Library, West Lafayette City Hall and businesses in the area.
