RE: June 2014 Monthly Report

During the month of June, the West Lafayette Police Department received **2,192 calls for service**, a decrease of 261 calls (11%) from May, and an increase of 195 calls (10%) from June 2013.

In June, proactive patrol work by Officer Travis Morgan netted several felony arrests of subjects for manufacturing methamphetamine. Officers dismantled one active meth lab and discovered components for another at a city apartment complex. WLPD officers were assisted by the Indiana State Police Meth Suppression Unit and the Purdue University Police Department in the discovery and dismantling of these dangerous drug labs.

Also this past month, the WLPD led an investigation that resulted in the arrest of one subject on charges of Intimidation and Threatening the Use of Explosive Materials. The Pine Village subject, who remains in Federal custody, had threatened to kill a WLPD officer, the Tippecanoe County Sheriff, a Tippecanoe County Judge and a Justice of the Indiana Supreme Court. The subject also threatened to blow up the Tippecanoe County Courthouse. WLPD detectives were assisted by the FBI and the Tippecanoe County Sheriff's Office in the investigation.

Twelve area women completed the WLPD RAD self-defense program in June. More RAD classes are planned for 2014, including a RAD Kids Camp later this month. Please contact Sgt. Cindy Marion or the department's website for camp details.
