

We would like to ask for your consideration to have the Tiny Spaces art project include the concrete stairs on the back of Morton Community Center and the pavement on the corner of Columbia and Chauncey. As you previously approved, the artist, Aaron Bumgarner, is installing hands in 15-20 places in the Village and Levee.

We are attaching photos to illustrate the proposal. They will be painted on concrete only where they could be power washed at such date that the city does not want them in place any longer.

Joe Payne suggested asking for BOW permission since the building is owned by the City of West Lafayette. Bess Witcosky, Morton Director, has reviewed this. The artist is eager to get started and is expected to have the entire project completed by mid-September.


