RE: November 2014 Monthly Report

During the month of November the West Lafayette Police Department received **2,311 calls for service**, a decrease of 169 calls (7%) from October, and an increase of 43 calls (2%) from November 2013.

Purdue University hosted the last two home football games of the season in November. The WLPD recorded few arrests during the festivities of these two home football game weekends. The consistent decline in custodial arrests this season is a welcomed trend. While activity in the city bar districts and overall calls for service this season were consistent with activity over the past several football seasons, custodial arrests for the 2014 season were at a five year low, averaging 5.5 arrests per home football game compared to an average of 8 arrests per home football game since 2010. At the same time, a renewed focus on personal and public safety initiatives on game weekends contributed to having no major injuries or major disturbances this season.

The WLPD's continued monthly drug-take-back program netted over 200 lbs. of drugs to be destroyed this past month. This popular public service program, managed by DARE Officer Janet Winslow, has removed tens of thousands of pounds of would be disposal contaminants over the past several years. The program has also made the children of our community safer by removing these unwanted drugs from medicine cabinets across our community.
