RE: June 2015 Monthly Report

During the month of June the West Lafayette Police Department received **2,043 calls for service**, a decrease of 469 calls (19%) from May, and a decrease of 149 calls (7%) from June 2014.

In a federal court last week, a WLPD case from June 2014 resulted in a conviction of a suspect that violated federal law by making threats in a Facebook post that he intended to kill a named WLPD Detective, the Tippecanoe County Sheriff and two named judges before he blew up the Tippecanoe County Courthouse. The work and testimony of several WLPD Detectives helped to secure this criminal conviction.

In June, Officers worked 48 hours of overtime patrols while participating in an Operation Pullover grant targeting seatbelt enforcement. Officers issued 75 traffic warnings and 71 traffic citations, including 62 for Failure to Wear a Seatbelt during these extra patrols.

In late June, after more than 24 years of honorable service, Sgt. Cindy Marion became the first woman officer to retire from the WLPD. Sgt. Marion's service is marked by several awards and honors for her exemplary detective work in crimes against children and sexual assault crimes against women. Sgt. Marion is responsible for launching several community outreach programs for the WLPD, including Rape Aggression Defense (RAD) training for women and seniors as well as RAD Kids training, a personal empowerment safety education program.
