Projects:

- Salisbury St. Safety Improvements, Ph. 3: This project is complete.
- Mid-Block Crossings Project: This project is complete.
- Cumberland Ave. Reconstruction, Ph. 3: Utility relocations continue along the roadway. Milestone Contractors continues to have traffic on the outside parking lane to begin phase 1 work. This phase of construction will include reconstruction of the center median of the street, including new storm water infrastructure and reconstructing the inside travel lanes. Parking along Cumberland is restricted during this time.
- Happy Hollow Reconstruction: The contract was awarded to Rieth Riley Construction with a low bid of \$5,937,070.00. The contractor is now waiting on INDOT for a notice to proceed. Utility relocations are continuing along the project. There is not a set start date at this time.

- Northwestern Ave. Safety Improvements, Ph. 3: Construction of the new median areas is complete and connections for the new street lights and traffic signals have been installed. The mid-block crossing is operating. The Dodge Street signal is set to be operational November 3rd. Construction is continuing for the new railings, signals and lighting. Daytime lane restrictions will be necessary in order to complete this work.
- 2014 CDBG Sidewalk Replacement Project: Fairfield Contractors have completed the new sidewalks and curbs on 4th Street and on Waldron Street.
- 2014 Street Resurfacing Project: Rieth-Riley Construction has begun a 2nd phase of street work this fall replacing the curb and sidewalk on the West side of S. Grant Street from Wood Street to Harrison Street.
