RE: February 2016 Monthly Report

During the month of February, the West Lafayette Police Department received **2,196 calls for service**, a decrease of 25 calls (1%) from January, and a decrease of 357 calls (14%) from February 2015. Calls for service were down this past month due to better than average weather.

Four WLPD Officers took part in the Impaired Driving Enforcement Grant Blitz throughout the month of February for a total of 15 hours of overtime patrols. The blitz netted several additional Operating While Intoxicated arrests, including one felony OWI arrest with an additional charge for Neglect of a Dependent.

Late last month, detectives closed several vehicle break-in cases with the arrest of a 19 year old Lafayette man for multiple counts of Theft. The vehicle break-ins occurred in the University Farm Neighborhood during the months of January and February. Detectives recovered a handgun stolen from a vehicle during the investigation and subsequent arrest.

Applications are being accepted for radKIDS safety camp, June 13th -17th. This training will be held at the Faith West Community Center, 1920 Northwestern Avenue. Kids ages 5 thru 7 will participate from 9:00 am to 11:30 am and ages 8 thru 12 will participate from 1:00 pm to 3:30 pm.
