RE: June 2016 Monthly Report

During the month of June, the West Lafayette Police Department received **2,256 calls for service**, a decrease of 417 calls (16%) from May, and an increase of 213 calls (10%) from June 2015.

The Criminal Investigation Division of our Department, led by Captain David VanVactor, worked with Patrol Officers to clear two major cases that occurred this past month. On June 4th, The front desk of the Four Points by Sheraton Hotel was robbed. Less than two weeks later, Detectives arrested three suspects for Robbery, Theft and Conspiracy to Commit Robbery.

One June 28th, a resident in the 2500 block of Soldiers Home Rd. returned home to his apartment as it was being burglarized by two individuals. The resident was assaulted upon entering his apartment and the two suspects then fled. Patrol Officers arrested one suspect within an hour of the incident for Residential Entry, Burglary, Theft and Battery. Detectives expect to make additional arrests in the case.

The WLPD completed a week long RAD Kids camp in June for 80 area children under the direction of Officer Marcus Slifer. The nationally recognized RAD Kids Personal Empowerment Safety Education Program enhances the ability of children and parents to utilize knowledge, skills and power to protect themselves from violence and harm. WLPD officers instructing the course were assisted by officers from the Lafayette Police Department and the Tippecanoe County Sheriff's Office as well as staff from the Tippecanoe County Prosecutor's Office and the Heartford House Child Advocacy Center.
